## Intrusion parents guide

Freida Pinto and Logan Marshall-Green star in a psychological thriller. The content rating is (5) for sex, nudity, violence, gore, profanity, and frightening scenes. The movie contains mild sex and nudity, with a woman kissing a man on a kitchen table. There's also a brief shower scene where nothing is seen. Violence is minimal until the final 30 minutes, when a character is hit in the head and another is shot through the abdomen. Some blood is shown, but it's not excessively graphic. Alcohol consumption is present, with adults drinking wine at a housewarming party. The movie also features a shocking twist similar to "Parasite." Some scenes show animal cruelty, including an image of a deceased animal with a pool of blood nearby. A Netflix film, "Intrusion," follows a couple's move to a small town after a traumatic home invasion, leading the wife to suspect those around her might not be who they seem. However, despite strong performances from Freida Pinto and Joel Courtney, the movie is widely criticized for being overly predictable, relying on worn-out thriller tropes, and failing to deliver on its promise. I wasn't blown away by this movie, but it did have one intense moment that genuinely scared me. It's a brief scene, but it's effective. Pinto, known from Slumdog Millionaire, is a sympathetic protagonist, though she seems perpetually distressed even when she's happy - probably because she knows the script. Marshall-Green gives an increasingly awkward performance that becomes laughable by the film's climax. Despite my negative review, I'd still recommend checking out this movie for a glimpse of the main characters' home - it's absolutely stunning. Watching a 90-minute tour of the house would have been preferable to sitting through another subpar thriller.
